Basic Training (previously known as BST):

Basic Training consists of four modules and is designed to satisfy the basic training and familiarization requirements of STCW.

These modules include:

- a. 12-Hour Personal Survival Techniques
- b. Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting
- c. 4-Hour Personal Safety & Social Responsibilities

d. 8 Hour First Aid & CPR

BT modules are offered at SEA, except for Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting.

Bridge Resource Management (BRM):

The Bridge Resource Management course aims to provide watch officers with a practical understanding of the bridge resource management and their integration into the procedures for maintaining a safe navigational watch, as per the guidance outlined in Section B-VIII/2 of the STCW code.

Leadership and Managerial Skills (LMS):

Using lectures, discussions of case studies, and practical exercises in hypothetical situations, the Leadership and Managerial Skills course will cover the principles of leadership and management in a shipboard environment. Open for mariners seeking an STCW certificate as master or mate on ocean or near-coastal vessels, this is a USCG approved course as per the guidance in Section A-II/1 and A-III/2 of the STCW code.

Wilderness First Responder- Recertification Course (WFR- Recert):

The WMA Open Recertification course is open to graduates of all wilderness medical training courses of 64 hours or longer with a current Wilderness First Responder certification. Successful graduates of this course will receive Wilderness Medical Associates' Wilderness First Responder, re-certification.

Wilderness First Responder (WFR):

The Wilderness First Responder program is the ideal medical training for leaders in remote areas including outdoor educators, guides, military, professional search and rescue teams, researchers, and those involved in the marine environment disaster relief. The curriculum is comprehensive and practical. It includes the essential principles and skills required to assess and manage medical problems in isolated and extreme environments for days and weeks if necessary. Certification is from Wilderness Medical Associates (WMA).
